Resolution of Town Board of the Town of Newburgh Providing for SEQR Designation and Determination for Proposed Adoption of the Town of Newburgh Comprehensive Plan Update and Providing for Scoping.

Please note that the Lead Agency has the option of conducting a "scoping session" as one alternative means of public participation once a draft Scope has been finalized.

Also enclosed is a completed draft Part 3 of the Long Form Environmental Assessment Form for the Action which contains a Positive Declaration.

RESOLUTION OF TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF NEWBURGH PROVIDING FOR SEQR DESIGNATION AND DETERMINATION FOR PROPOSED TOWN OF NEWBURGH COMPREHENSIVE PLAN UPDATE AND PROVIDING FOR SCOPING

Councilman _____ presented the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman _____.

WHEREAS, the Town of Newburgh has initiated a Comprehensive Plan Update process so as to update and amend the Town's Comprehensive Plan Update adopted in October, 2005, as amended from time to time thereafter (the 2005 Comprehensive Plan Update), which reconstituted and amended the Town's Master Plan adopted in March, 1991; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Newburgh has heretofore caused an inventory and analysis of its resources to be prepared; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has duly established and appointed a "Comprehensive Plan Update Committee" (the "Committee") whose membership included a member of the Town's Planning Board and a member of the Town's Zoning Board of Appeals; and

WHEREAS, the Committee has coordinated the preparation of the Comprehensive Plan Update to address particular areas of concern and conducted three public input sessions where members of the public were invited to participate and contribute to the planning process and included a link on the Town's Web-site that allows member of the public to submit written comments for consideration in order to assure full opportunity for citizen participation in the preparation of the proposed plan; and

WHEREAS, the Committee caused to be prepared and reviewed a draft Comprehensive Plan Update which includes proposed recommended planning and zoning action items, proposed rezonings, recommended Code enforcement textual clarifications, proposed transportation action items and proposed water, sewer and utility action items; and WHEREAS, the Town Board and the Committee recognize the importance of sound

planning as a means of promoting responsible development and protecting the health, safety and general welfare of the citizens of the Town of Newburgh and otherwise fulfilling the legislative findings and intent set forth in Town Law Section 272-a; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has determined that the proposed adoption of the Comprehensive Plan Update should be reviewed as an action (the "Action") under Part 617 of the General Regulations ("Part 617") adopted pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law ("SEQR") and Chapter 100 entitled "Environmental Quality Review" of the Town of Newburgh Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Newburgh has caused a full Environmental Assessment Form (the "EAF") to be prepared for the proposed adoption of the Comprehensive Plan Update (the "Action"); and

WHEREAS, the Town Board proposes to undertake, fund and approve the Action and wishes to assume Lead Agency status in connection with the review of the Action pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has determined that the following agencies identified by the EAF, using all due diligence, are involved or interested agencies for the Action:

Orange County Department of Planning

Town of Newburgh Planning Board

Town of Newburgh Comprehensive Plan Update Committee

Town of Newburgh Zoning Board of Appeals

New York State Department of Environmental Conservation; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has caused the EAF to be delivered to all said agencies and notified them that a lead agency must be agreed upon within thirty (30) calendar days of the date of mailing and of the Town Board's intent to be the lead agency in a coordinated review of the Action; and

WHEREAS, the identified agencies have either agreed that the Town Board shall act as the Lead Agency for the Action or not responded within the thirty (30) calendar day time frame established under SEQR.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Town Board pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law ("SEQR"), Part 617 of the General Regulations adopted pursuant thereto ("Part 617") and Chapter 100 entitled "Environmental Quality Review" of the Town of Newburgh Municipal Code, hereby declares itself Lead Agency for this Type I Action for the purpose of conducting a coordinated review; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Lead Agency hereby finds that the update of the Comprehensive Plan is one of the most significant land use actions to be undertaken by the Town of Newburgh, New York State Town Law §272-a providing that all town land use regulations must be in accordance with the Comprehensive Plan, said Comprehensive Plan Update will identify and address land use-related issues in the Town and will provide recommendations for future growth and change, including a series of subsequent actions, such as amendments of the Town's Zoning Code, and an opportunity to integrate various efforts and programs throughout the Town; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Board, as Lead Agency, hereby determines that said Action may have a significant effect on the environment by producing recommendations which when ultimately adopted may lead to substantial changes in the use or intensity of use of land including agricultural, open space or recreational resources, or in its capacity to support existing uses, and accordingly does issue the Positive Declaration annexed hereto and made a part hereof; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Positive Declaration be filed and distributed and notice of the Positive Declaration published in the Environmental Notice Bulletin in accordance with the requirements of SEQR and Part 617.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Board, as Lead Agency, hereby determines that a Draft Generic Environmental Impact Statement ("DGEIS") shall be prepared for the Action as provided in §617.10(b) of Part 617; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Board, as lead agency and project sponsor, hereby determines that scoping shall be conducted and a draft scope shall be prepared, provided to all the above agencies and others who have expressed interest in the Comprehensive Plan Update in writing, its availability noticed in the ENB and published on the Town's website, and that a period of twenty (20) days following the latter of notice or publication be provided for the public to review and provide written comments on the draft scope.

The action may have a significant effect on the environment by producing recommendations which when ultimately adopted may lead to substantial changes in the use or intensity of use of land including agricultural, open space or recreational resources, or in its capacity to support existing uses. By it's very nature as an update, the proposed action will not be consistent with the currently adopted Town of Newburgh Comprehensive Plan and may have a moderate to large consistency impact.
