We don't have a lot of room 14 to work with and the solider pile wall can kind 15 of blend in a lot better than a concrete, modern 16 17 structure.

MR. MANLEY: I've spoken to Richie 18 Rosencrans about this. He's now the director of 19 Millhouse. So hopefully we can all work together 20 to make sure it's aesthetic and that kind of 21 stuff, too. 22

At this point it's 10 still, I guess, under review. I'm not sure how 11 that is, but I have no objections to it at this 12 point because I don't know too much about it. 13 But anything to bring business in to the Town, I 14 would look at it with definitely and open mind 15 because we definitely need that. As I indicated 16 17 before, small businesses are suffering in the Town of Newburgh as you well know. So anything 18 to boost them up, including that mall that we 19 have, it would help the area. So I'm looking 20 forward to additional information with that. 21 My next question or comment is I 22 recently saw that your son, Gil, was given the 23 position with our Parks Department. I think it's 24

25 junior custodian or something like that. I don't

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2 know. I kind of found that to be an issue in 3 terms of you being the Supervisor and of course 4 your son, it would almost be like a nepotism type 5 of situation, and I wanted -- or a conflict of 6 interest being you are our Town Supervisor. Did 7 you not see that or feel that that would have 8 been a conflict of interest?

9 SUPERVISOR PIAQUADIO: Well let me say 10 this, Ms. Tirado. I really didn't take part too much in the hiring process in any way. 11 I would say this, though. I've been with this Town 12 twenty-four years in one aspect or another, and I 13 don't know if anyone thinks I waited twenty-four 14 years just to be in a position where I could hire 15 my first born to clean toilet bowls. Really. 16

17 MS. TIRADO: Well I hope not.

SUPERVISOR PIAQUADIO: I mean I've got 18 to laugh with you, too, on this one. And I don't 19 think I'm the first one guilty of their child 20 21 working where their father works. Unfortunately it looks like I control everything here, but, you 22 know, what I really don't control everything. 23 I don't think what I've done was any ethics issue. 24 If we did, we can turn it in to the Ethics Board 25

24	Ethics Board. All of the alarm systems and the	
25	monitoring in this Town is monitored by my famil	ly

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business but we're not -- the Town is not charged 2 for anything. So that's about \$25,000 a year 3 that in a way is donated to the Town. And I 4 don't write it off either on the income tax. So 5 that's where I stand. I always try to be б straight and forward. I hope that answers it, 7 Ms. Tirado. 8 MS. TIRADO: It does, and I appreciate 9 10 you being honest and frank with me. Thank you so much. 11 SUPERVISOR PLAQUADIO: Thank you. 12 Okay. Anyone else that we have? 13 MR. ROBERT PIAQUADIO: Lauren Mandel. 14 SUPERVISOR PIAQUADIO: Okay. It says 15 Mandel on the screen but I can't see them here. 16 Do we have a question? Do we have a question, 17 Bob? 18 MR. MS. MANDEL: I'm sorry about that. Ι 3 did just have a couple of questions just relating 4 back to the January meeting. You know, I was 5 really concerned. In my neighborhood, just б around the corner, there was a meth lab that was 7 deconstructed that was found out, thank God, by 8 the Town of Newburgh Police. I don't know if the 9 FBI were involved in that or not. It was really 10 shocking to me. It's a really nice neighborhood 11 next to my neighborhood. A much nicer 12 neighborhood than my neighborhood I guess. When 13 I say nicer, I mean upper class neighborhood more 14 than mine so. And that was really shocking. 15

And then again, you know, just really 16 17 concerned about the drug issue in the Town relating to opioids and other illegal drugs that 18 are flooding our Newburgh streets. I know we've 19 got a dog for bombs, but I really, again, feel 20 like drugs and drug enforcement and drug 21 ratification in our community needs to be a 22 priority and I don't hear a lot about it. I get 23 24 continually concerned about that because, again, especially with that meth lab being found. I 25

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mean that was a big operation that was going on. 2 It wasn't a little operation. And, you know, 3 that's just one example of other home businesses 4 that are running right in our neighborhood 5 besides the one that was turned down by the б Planning -- the Zoning Board. So I want to bring 7 up that issue. I don't know if you -- I have 8 another question as well, though. So I didn't 9 know if you want me to ask both questions at once 10 or if you want to answer that one first. 11

12 SUPERVISOR PIAQUADIO: Chief, can you 13 answer that question for her? You've got to 14 unmute yourself.

CHIEF CAMPBELL: Well, first of all I 15 can't speak too much about that particular case, 16 17 only because it is an ongoing investigation and not to jeopardize any type of prosecution going 18 there. Although I can say that we don't have any 19 evidence that he was actually producing and 20 selling methamphetamines from there. That's the 21 first type of lab that we found here in the Town 22 of Newburgh. Like I can't really go into detail 23 as to what transpired there but I can say I don't 24 believe it's a widespread concern, at least as 25

2 far as methamphetamines.

Now, drugs in general are certainly a concern, and we are looking to add K-9s for drug intervention and other programs that we can help to do some drug intervention. That's part of our plan going forward. But the drugs are definitely a concern for us and it's something we continue to work on every day.

10 MS. MANDEL: Are we involved in drug 11 court in the Town of Newburgh or is that just the 12 City of Newburgh?

CHIEF CAMPBELL: Court in general, just 13 because of the COVID situation, has practically 14 There's no in-person court right now. 15 shutdown. There is no longer any bail for any drug-related 16 17 offenses. This is the unfortunate part of the bail reform is that when you would arrest 18 somebody for the possession of narcotics, that 19 would be maybe their opportunity to dry out a 20 little bit and be able to kick it, or at least 21 get themselves into a program. We're essentially 22 issuing them appearance tickets and back out on 23 the street within hours and --24

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MS. MANDEL: I do understand that. I

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guess what I was asking -- just my ignorance -in the City of Newburgh I know they do have
access to the drug court. It is video, you're
correct. But I do work with that drug court. Is
that something that we have in the Town of
Newburgh also or is it only for the City of
Newburgh?

CHIEF CAMPBELL: We don't have that 9 10 number of drug arrests here, but we work with the courts in all of those programs, and we work 11 closely with the City of Newburgh as well. And 12 I've met, probably about a year ago now, with 13 some of the judges over in the City of Newburgh 14 as well trying to -- everything is trying to 15 We're trying to evolve into how we can 16 evolve. 17 best handle these drug programs and deal with some of these issues without incarceration, but 18 also to get people the help they need and try to 19 persuade them to get help even if they don't 20 21 think they need it. We're working on it.

22 MS. MANDEL: And how about having Hope 23 Not Handcuffs work with you guys?

24 CHIEF CAMPBELL: We have not been 25 approached by those guys. My understanding was

TOWN BOARD MEETING - 2/8/21 1 35 that they don't have any of the angels that live 2 in our area, or at least our jurisdiction. 3 MS. MANDEL: No, no. You actually 4 approach them. They don't solicit any business. 5 Chiefs of police from different jurisdictions б actually reach out to them or ask -- because 7 you're inviting them into your house. 8 CHIEF CAMPBELL: Sure. 9 10 MS. MANDEL: That's actually how that works. 11 I'm certainly open to 12 CHIEF CAMPBELL: that. That was maybe my misunderstanding. I was 13 under the impression that they didn't have anyone 14 in our area that lived here that was an angel 15 that could provide the support here. 16 I'11 certainly reach out to them without hesitation. 17 MS. MANDEL: That would be great. 18 MR. MANLEY: Chief, can I just say 19 something on that? 20 21 Lauren, two or three times, including about three weeks ago, I messaged Hope Not 22 Handcuffs on their Facebook page. It comes up 23 that we'll get back to you. I gave them my 24 number and everything and have not heard from 25

2 them.

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I'll reach out to Annette MS. MANDEL: 3 She's the executive director. Kahrs. T know 4 they just got a huge grant so they're expanding. 5 I'll reach out to Annette. I don't have -- I б could send -- I don't know how to connect you and 7 Annette together but I'll get the message to them 8 9 to reach out to you. 10 CHIEF CAMPBELL: The other chief I had spoke to said they reached out to them. 11 I'm certainly willing to meet with them at any time. 12 MS. MANDEL: Okay. That would be 13 great. That makes me a little happier. 14 And then also just the other question 15 that I want to ask or request is that, and I 16 quess I don't know if it goes to the Board or to 17 Gil specifically, but, you know, the Zoom -- you 18 guys having Zoom meetings is tremendous. 19 Τt makes this whole process so much better for me 20 21 personally as a citizen. You know, I asked the Planning Board to please, you know, do the same, 22 and I was told by Joe Pedi that, you know, it's 23 up to the leader of that group to make that 24 decision. I e-mailed the leader of that group. 25

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He did not bother to even respond to my e-mail. He actually communicated to me through Joe, and Joe was, of course, always a gentleman, he conveyed everything to me. And, you know, it really was his response I thought was so inappropriate.
