PEDI: Mr. Supervisor, notice 7 of this meeting had been posted on the 8 Town's website since June 1st of 2021 and 9 it was posted in Town Hall also on June 1, 10 It was advertised in The Mid-Hudson 2021. 11 Times on June 3, 2021 and in The Orange 12 County Post on June 4, 2021. This 13 complies with all the requirements for a 14 public hearing under New York State law. 15 SUPERVISOR PIAQUADIO: All right. 16 17 So with that, does someone want to make a motion to open this public hearing? 18 MR. RUGGIERO: I'll make the 19 motion. 20 21 MS. GREENE: I'll second your motion. 22 MR. PEDI: Motion made and 23 seconded to open this public hearing at 24 7:01 p.m. Mrs. Greene? 25

11	So with that, maybe I'll give a
12	quick rundown of this hotel/motel tax, if
13	you would. It goes back a number of
14	years. Councilman George Mosley, rest his
15	soul, some eleven years ago introduced
16	this bill originally. We had at that time
17	Senator Larkin present it to Albany. That
18	would be a tax on hotels and motels within
19	the Town of Newburgh. That would be up to
20	a 5 percent tax. It would generate quite
21	a bit of revenue for the Town. And it
22	also, quite often, doesn't tax local
23	residents. George used to say if you're a
24	local resident using a hotel, maybe you're
25	doing something you're not supposed to do.

Those are George's words. Ouite often it 2 gets people really from out of town. 3 You do get calls for service for police and 4 fire and whatnot, so it is probably a good 5 Anyway, after eleven years we've б tax. been trying repeatedly. Eleven years ago 7 the State said we're not going to give it 8 to the Town but we'll give it to the 9 10 County. The County actually adopted a hotel/motel tax they've been collecting on 11 12 for many years at 5 percent. This year, as of January 1st, again we asked for it. 13 Senator Skoufis and Assemblyman Jacobsen 14 actually carried it to Albany and 15 sponsored it for us. This time it did 16 pass. 17

It's a hotel/motel, and I believe 18 Airbnb rentals also. It can be up to 5 19 percent. I think that's what we're asking 20 for in this initial bill. I would like to 21 see in any way possible this bill, if it 22 passes, eventually be named after George. 23 This should be a George Mosely bill 24 because he was the one who instituted it 25

TOWN BOARD MEETING - 6/14/2021 7 1 originally. 2 So with that being said, I'd like 3 to open it to the public. Anyone who has 4 a question on this topic, hotel/motel tax, 5 we will listen to you. So you can raise б your hand electronically or physically. 7 Bobby, we have one on the 8 telephone that we can't really see. 9 Can 10 we open that person in case that person wants to talk? 11 Carlaiello I believe it is. Do 12 you have anything for this? You have to 13 unmute yourself if you want to talk. 14 (No response.) 15 SUPERVISOR PIAQUADIO: Okay. 16 So 17 I guess they're not going to. MILANO: This is Martin 5 Milano, 1 Crossroads Court, owner of the б Hampton Inn & Suites in Newburgh. Can you 7 quys hear me? 8 SUPERVISOR PIAQUADIO: Yes. Very 9 10 well. We can hear you good. MR. MILANO: Okay. Twenty-five 11 years ago when these programs first came 12 out I was in Montgomery County and I was 13 the chairman of the tax committee for the 14 county. I know a lot about this program 15 and how it works and the rest. When we 16 first enacted this we did a 1 or 2 17 percent, you know, tax on it where if your 18 bill was \$100, well now it was 101 or 102 19 and nobody noticed it and it was okay. 20 21 Then the county, you know, put in the 5 percent tax, which at the time we had 22 pushback from our customers that, you 23 know, the prices were high. Now that it's, 24 you know, approaching 20 percent, I have a 25

TOWN BOARD MEETING - 6/14/2021 1 11 lot of concerns, and here's what I did. 2 The surrounding areas that are, 3 you know, available for hotel users, the 4 majority of them have a lower tax rate 5 than what we're proposing. The areas that б have this 18 percent tax, which would be 7 Middletown and Woodbury, which I own a 8 9 hotel in, the customers are not happy about the tax, and we deal with a lot of 10 pushback and they expect us to lower our 11 It lowers the value of the hotel 12 rates. which will, in turn, lower the taxes --13 the real estate taxes that you may get for 14 those hotels. 15 But the other thing is, you know, 16 Woodbury Commons is an international 17 destination that people know about 18 worldwide. Middletown has got a 19 tremendous amount of growth. I don't know 20 21 if Newburgh is in that spot right now. What I fear is that due to the pandemic 22 and a time that we need to be more user 23 24 friendly and that we're fighting to get not only our customers back but the rates 25

that we used to get, when we're going to 2 quote 18 or 20 percent, the customers are 3 going to ask us why are we charging that. 4 I don't know if I have an answer to give 5 them right now. When the airport was, you б know, pushing a million customers a year 7 and everything else was, you know, going 8 the way we planned, you know, putting this 9 10 in would probably be okay. You know, even then it wouldn't be great but it would be 11 more understandable. Now, coming down out 12 of the pandemic, now I've got to tell 13 people or try to lower the rates any way 14 that they can that their tax is 20 15 percent, I just don't know how that's 16 17 going to go over. I think what it may do is if people know the tax here is that 18 high and we're not on a beach and we're 19 not New York City, they may decide to go 20 to New Paltz where the tax is 10 percent. 21 They may decide to go to Port Jervis where 22 it's 9 percent. Nanuet is 11.38 percent. 23 I feel at this point in time we're being 24 put at a competitive disadvantage. 25 Thev

can go down the street to New Windsor 2 where I think the price is around 13 3 percent and get a 5 percent discount 4 before they even, you know, do anything. 5 I'm just worried that this may turn some б people away from Newburgh, and now you 7 won't get the hotel tax but you're also 8 going to miss out on all the money they 9 10 spend at restaurants and gas stations and everything else. 11 I'm just thinking right now, 12 because of the pandemic and everything, 13

the timing of this is not great. 14 I've lived this, I've done it for thirty years, 15 I was the chairman of the committee. 16 Т know a lot about this. Of course I'd like 17 to see -- if this was just about 18 collecting money from out of town people 19 and giving it to the Town, that's a no --20 that's a win-win situation. But I feel it 21 may scare people away, and especially in 22 this environment. 20 percent, I mean 23 that's a hard pill to swallow for some 24 people, and they may just go to the next 25

town or tell me, you know, I have to lower
my rates. Considering what we just went
through with the pandemic, that's putting
me at a competitive disadvantage.

So I just wanted everyone to know б my thoughts on it. I do have a lot of 7 involvement in it. Of course I'd like to 8 see our Town that I live in and love get 9 10 all this revenue, but maybe the timing isn't right. We can evaluate the timing 11 12 or the percentage at this point, and when everything recovers and the airport is 13 going and everything is back to normal, 14 then people would probably be more 15 receptive to pay a tax that high. Right 16 now I'm wondering how am I going to 17 present this to my customers. A lot of 18 customers are not from -- you know, 19 they're not leisure travelers, they're 20 21 business people who are here all the time, and now we're making it hard for them to 22 do business. There's a surcharge on them. 23 It seems like it could be, you know, 24 anticompetitive. 25

13	It totals out to 18.125. Woodbury is the
14	only town in Orange County that had it for
15	years. Woodbury would get approved, we
16	would get denied. Port Jervis got denied.
17	Town of Wallkill got denied. This year
18	every one of us got approved. Town of
19	Wallkill's already passed and already
20	started charging the extra 5 percent, so
21	they're at the same rate, the 18.125.
22	Donette, do you have a comment
23	for the Board?
24	I didn't mean to cut you off,
25	Scott.

MS. SMITH: That's okay. 2 Sure. I think he made -- I'm sorry. Marty I 3 I don't know if he's still on the quess. 4 line, but he did make really good points 5 actually. Just recovering from the б pandemic, you know, businesses are trying 7 to get back. Certainly I'm sure his 8 businesses took a really big hit during 9 10 the pandemic. So I appreciate that Skoufis and 11 Jacobsen got this done. That's great. 12 Maybe 5 percent right now is too much. 13 Is there a consideration of going a little 14 more gradually then so his customers and 15 his business doesn't get hit so hard? 16 Could it be 2 percent? 17 SUPERVISOR PIAQUADIO: That's 18 what this public hearing is about. 19 It's up to the Board to reach that. That's 20 21 what we're trying to do. I was really asking -- I was really polling our Board. 22 Do you have anything else, 23 24 Donette? MS. SMITH: I thought you 25 No.

б	entertainment, outdoor dining. It came
7	about again due to COVID, restaurants
8	couldn't be open, residents inside or
9	customers inside. We came out to make
10	this a little more permanent.
11	I don't know if Mark Taylor wants
12	to tell us a little bit about it. Mark
13	Taylor disappeared from the screen. There
14	he is.
15	Mark, can you give us a rundown
16	on the
17	MR. TAYLOR: Surely. The Town
18	previously authorized outdoor dining at
19	existing eating and drinking places,
20	restaurants and establishments that had
21	seating outdoors, under emergency powers
22	that were orders that were issued
23	pursuant to the pandemic.
24	This local law will extend
25	outdoor seating, or that permission for

outdoor seating for this calendar year 2 only to those establishments under a 3 permit system so that the emergency order 4 power doesn't -- isn't the basis for the 5 authority of granting the ability to have б outdoor seating. The establishments can 7 apply for and obtain a permit from the 8 Code Compliance Department for the outdoor 9 seating. If they've already obtained 10 approvals from the Code Compliance 11 Department for outdoor seating, they will 12 be issuing the permit under the grant that 13 already occurred. 14

15 So essentially we're extending 16 the period for one year to afford relief 17 to restaurants and other establishments 18 that were hard hit by the pandemic to have 19 outdoor seating for all of this calendar 20 year.

21 SUPERVISOR PIAQUADIO: All right. 22 Very good. So with that we'll open to the 23 public. Anyone who has a comment on this 24 outdoor dining, we'll entertain your 25 comments. Anyone?

2 Bill Fetter. We can unmute Bill 3 Fetter.

MR. FETTER: Bill Fetter, 4 Rockwood Drive. A question here is that 5 if an owner invests money into upgrading б his facility to accommodate the outdoor 7 dining, at the end of this period -- at 8 the end of the year, we're not going to 9 10 have the owner come say well I invested so much money, I'd like to keep it and be 11 blanketly approved without going through a 12 planning procedure to make it a permanent 13 outdoor configuration. I don't want to 14 see somebody say I spent thousands so 15 that's enough for me to make this a 16 permanent situation. I understand these 17 people need to make their money back. I'm 18 not denying that in the least. This is 19 not going to turn into a permanent 20 situation without a planning review is my 21 question or input? 22

23 MR. TAYLOR: Mr. Fetter, I'll 24 respond to that. The local law does not 25 authorize the installation of permanent

In order to make permanent 2 improvements to the site, the 3 establishment would have to apply to the 4 Planning Board for site plan approval. 5 This essentially allows them to set up 6 seating in parking areas or similar areas 7 that will accommodate the seating. 8 MR. FETTER: Okay. I know there 9 10 are a select few that have, you know, taken good advantage of this. I don't 11 want to see it be a permanent situation 12 without a planning review. Thank you. 13 SUPERVISOR PIAQUADIO: Thank you, 14 Bill. 15 Anyone else on this topic? 16 17 (No response.) SUPERVISOR PIAQUADIO: Betty, do 18 19 you have anything? MS. So it's a change in the 18 scope of work. 19

To remove those, we had the engineers on that project, Collier's Design, negotiate a cost with the contractor, and that will be \$29,700 total for that additional work.
