15	rundown? Our Town Attorney, Mark Taylor. Mark,

17	MR. TAYLOR: Okay. Can you hear me
18	now?

20	SUPERVISOR PIAQUADIO: We can hear you

22	MR. TAYLOR: So this parcel is at the
23	northeast corner of the intersection of Route 300
24	and Jeanne Drive. The owner has appealed the
25	assessment for 2019 and 2020. The settlement

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provides for a reduction of \$81,800 in the 2019 2 assessment and a reduction of \$181,500 in the 3 2020 assessment, going from \$1,800,000 in 4 assessed value to \$898,500 assessed value for 5 That assessment will remain fixed for an 2020. 6 7 additional three years, not subject to challenge or adjustment by the Town unless certain 8 9 circumstances warrant changes under the statute. 10 The total refund liability for the 11 Town, including town and highway taxes and the fire district, will be about \$1,239 for 2019. 12 13 Depending on whether there's a reduction prior to 14 the 2020 roll being submitted and the judge 15 shunning the order, there may be an additional 16 refund liability of \$2,749 for the 2020 tax bill. SUPERVISOR PIAQUADIO: Okay. So we've 17 18 had a chance to look at it. I guess this is the 19 recommendation from our certiorari attorney also, 20 Kathy Drobne. 21 Does someone want to make a motion to 22 settle this on 5 Jeanne Drive? 23 MR. MANLEY: I'll make the motion. 24 MR. RUGGIERO: And I'll second it. 25 MR. PEDI: Any further discussion?

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2 credit here for putting this together. It talks about Saturday and the importance of shopping 3 4 local. It's probably more important than ever, the way things have been, to the local retailers. 5 I'm going to ask Scott. Can you read 6 7 this off for us, Scott, please? MR. MANLEY: Yeah. I just want to give 8 9 a quick background. Obviously small businesses 10 are very much hurting. There's just a report out 11 by the businesses about the billions of dollars they made, but small businesses are down 200 12 billion dollars. Saturday is Shop Small 13 14 Saturday. I've been pushing small businesses for 15 ages. Anthony LoBiondo, as soon as he became a 16 Councilman, jumped right on there with me. Both 17 Anthony and Councilman Ruggiero have their own 18 small business, so it means a lot to all of us, 19 and we need to support our local businesses. 20 So based on that, we're doing a 21 proclamation for the Town Board. Whereas, the

Town of Newburgh, New York celebrates our local small businesses and the contributions they make to our local economy and community. According to the United States Small Business Administration, TOWN WORKSHOP MEETING - 11/23/20

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there are 31.7 million small businesses in the 2 United States. They represent 99.9 percent of 3 all firms with paid employees in the United 4 States, are responsible for 65.1 percent of net 5 new jobs created from 2000 to 2019. 6 7 And whereas, small businesses employ 47.1 percent of the employees in the private 8 9 sector in the United States. 62 percent of 10 United States small businesses reported that they 11 need to see consumer spending return to pre-COVID levels by the end of 2020 in order to stay in 12 13 business. 65 percent of the United States small 14 business owners said it would be the most helpful 15 to their businesses to have their regulars return 16 and start making purchases again, and 17 three-quarters of consumers are currently looking 18 for ways to shop small and support their 19 community. 20 And whereas, 96 percent of consumers

who shop on Small Business Saturday agree that shopping at small, independently-owned businesses support their commitment to making purchases that have a positive social, economic and environmental impact. And 97 percent of

TOWN WORKSHOP MEETING - 11/23/20 1 16 2 consumers who shopped on Small Business Saturday agree that small businesses are essential to 3 4 their community. And whereas, 95 percent of consumers 5 who shop on Small Business Saturday reported the 6 7 day makes them want to shop or eat at small, 8 independently-owned businesses all year long, not 9 just during the holiday season. 10 And whereas, the Town of Newburgh, New 11 York supports our local businesses that create 12 jobs, boost our local economy and preserve our 13 communities. 14 And whereas, advocacy groups, as well 15 as public and private organizations across the country, have endorsed the Saturday after 16 17 Thanksgiving as Small Business Saturday. 18 Be it resolved, the Town Board of the 19 Town of Newburgh do hereby proclaim November 28, 20 2020 as Small Business Saturday. 21 SUPERVISOR PIAQUADIO: All right.
